BAF Goes to the White House

BAF Alumni **Drs. Nnenia Campbell** and **Dontá Council** represented the Bill Anderson Fund in a climate resilience roundtable at the White House at the end of February.

The event was hosted by the DHS Center for Faith Based and Neighborhood Partnerships in collaboration with the <u>Black Resilience Network</u>, of which the BAF is a founding member. This roundtable was the first time in history that a collective of Black-led organizations has convened with FEMA, other federal agencies, and private sector stakeholders to discuss pathways to strengthening climate and disaster resilience in Black towns and communities.

Last but certainly not least, BAF Alumnus **Dr. Marccus Hendricks** was a featured speaker representing the White House Council on Environmental Quality! More about that below.
